Transfer Admission Process and Requirements

- No application fee and no separate scholarship application!
- Apply online at <u>apply.truman.edu</u> or through the Common Application.
- Send official transcripts from all prior colleges and exam score reports directly to Truman State University Office of Admission. High school transcripts and ACT or SAT scores are only required for transfer students applying with less than 24 transferable credit hours earned post high school graduation.
- Deadlines for full scholarship consideration are March 15 (for fall starters) and November 1 (for spring starters). Applicants must have all application materials submitted by those dates for full consideration.
- Admission review is holistic and individualized, considering a student's full academic record, essay, and involvement.

International Transfer Students

- International transfer students should apply via this link. Standard deadlines are June 1 for fall starters, November 1 for spring starters, and January 15 for the Nursing program (fall starters only).
- International Transfer Students are required to submit the following: one page essay, English proficiency score, original or certified copy of high school transcripts and any college or university previously attended, certificate of financial support, financial support documentation, and copy of passport.
- International transfer credit may be accepted at Truman. For more information, see http://Truman.edu/international and click "Applying."

Returning and Readmitted Students

- Students returning to Truman, who have not attended another institution, and who are in good academic standing or on Academic Probation, should complete the Returning Student Form online.
- Students who have attended another institution since leaving Truman should apply online as Transfer Students.
- Students whose academic standing is currently Academic Suspension and have attended another institution must petition for reinstatement. Petitions must be in written form, accompanied by supporting documentation, addressed to appeals@truman.edu or c/o Center for Academic Excellence.

Credit Evaluations

- Official evaluations by the Registrar's office are available shortly after acceptance as a transfer student.
- Unofficial course-by-course transfer equivalencies are available at <u>willittransfer.truman.edu</u>.

2018-2019 Tuition and Fees

- Flat Rate Tuition for Full-Time Students (12 to 17 credit hours);
 - Missouri Residents: \$7,425 per year (\$3,712.50 per semester)
 - Non-Missouri Residents: \$14,277 per year (\$7,138.50 per semester)
- Required Fees: \$524 per year (on-campus); \$374 per year (off-campus)
- Room & Board: Average estimated at \$8,780 per year, includes meal plan
- Books and Supplies: Estimated at \$1,000 per year

Scholarships and Financial Aid

- Consideration for automatic and competitive transfer scholarships is based on application materials.
- Priority competitive scholarship consideration deadlines are March 15 for fall starters and November 1 for spring starters. After those dates, consideration is on a rolling basis.
- Automatic awards include the Transfer Recognition Scholarship, Phi Theta Kappa Automatic Scholarship, Midwest Student Exchange Program, and Bulldog Legacy Scholarship.
- Competitive awards include the Phi Theta Kappa Competitive Scholarship, Community College Honorary Scholarship, and Transfer President's Honorary Scholarship.

Academic Policies

- GPA: Truman transcripts track and display three GPAs: Transfer (all graded credit attempted at other institutions); Institutional (graded credit from Truman State University) and Overall (all graded credit attempted).
- Scholarship renewal criteria is based on Institutional GPA.
- Other academic qualifications, honors, admission policies may use either Institutional or Overall GPA.
- Repeat Policy: All attempts are included in GPA calculation, even if excluded at a previous institution. Details here: http://catalog.truman.edu/content.php?catoid=13&navoid=624#Grades and Grade Point Average.
- University Graduation Requirements:
 - 45 credits must be earned at Truman State University
 - 120 total credits required for most B.A. and B.S. degrees. Some degrees may require up to 131 total credits.
 - Minimum overall GPA of 2.0 required for graduation.
 - 40 credits must be earned at the upper level (course number 300+)
 - 63 credits must be earned in courses designated as Liberal Arts and Sciences courses
 - Individual degree programs may have separate applications, other GPA requirements, or credit-inresidency requirements.
