



Transfer Program Guide
Indian Hills Community College (IHCC) Associates of Arts (AA)
to
Bachelor of Science in Justice Systems (BS)

Completion of the AA degree at IHCC fulfills the Essential Skills, Modes of Inquiry, and Intercultural Perspective requirements in Truman State University's Liberal Studies Program (LSP). Students transferring with an AA are still required to complete a 3-credit JINS course, and to demonstrate elementary proficiency in one foreign language, in addition to the remaining major requirements, required support, and the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science requirement, and the Missouri Statute requirements. In addition to completing the required courses for the AA degree at IHCC, students intending to transfer to Truman State University are advised to take the below courses as part of their degree program at IHCC. Completion of CRJ 100 and SOC 230 at IHCC along with the AA degree will allow for a smooth transition to Truman. The remaining CRJ and SOC courses listed below will transfer to Truman and will fulfill major requirements in the Justice Systems degree, but are not all specifically required for the degree.

The above plan is not a substitute for academic advising. Students are strongly encouraged to consult with an advisor at both IHCC and Truman State when developing an academic plan.

Other Graduation Requirements:

- Minor or Required Support: Each student must have a minor or required support. Required support consists of fifteen credits as approved by a justice systems advisor, from other disciplines and/or a justice systems internship.
- All Justice Systems majors must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.20. Additionally, all majors must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.20 in justice systems courses. Failure to maintain either of the GPAs results in suspension from the major, prevents taking additional justice systems courses, and precludes graduation with a justice systems degree. At least 15 of the required credits in the major must be completed by taking courses at Truman.

In order to graduate with a Bachelor's degree, all students at Truman State University are required to satisfy the following:

- A 2.0 minimum cumulative GPA (unless a higher requirement is specified), a 2.0 minimum GPA in all coursework completed at Truman, and a 2.0 major GPA
- 120 total credits
- 40 credits of upper-level courses (courses numbered 300+)
- 45 credits must be completed in residence, 28 of which must immediately precede completion of requirements for the degree, 15 of which must be major requirements
- The Truman Week requirement is waived for all transfer students.
- Completion of the Liberal Studies Program (LSP). LSP requirements can be found in the Truman State University catalog.
- 63 credits of courses with the Liberal Arts and Sciences (LAS) designation. A list of LAS-designated courses can be found in the Truman State University Catalog.
