Meet the Pre-Vet Advisor in Biology: Stephanie Fore





I went to a small liberal arts college in North Carolina and graduated with a BS in Biology. After graduation, I worked as a research technician in a heart disease lab. I returned to school and received an MS in Plant Pathology from North Carolina State University and a Ph.D. in Botany from Miami University. I am a professor in the Biology Department and curator of Truman's Mammal Museum,

the largest collection of small mammals in the state for research.

Focus on Pre-Health Professions

My current research interests are tick ecology with a specific interest in their capacity to transmit pathogens. Greater than 60% of emerging infectious diseases are zoonotic (pathogens that are transmit from animals to people) and ticks vector more pathogens than any other arthropod. As part of this research, students are involved in trapping and handling small mammals. Several research students from my lab have gone to veterinary school. In addition, I teach a large mammal capture course in South Africa in which students get hands-on training in safe handling of wild animals. Outside of Truman, I have invested years in pet rescue and helping pets living in poverty.



If you are in your second year at Truman AND majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Exercise Science, or Health Science:
