At this point in the year...

First Year

- Research a multitude of healthcare options and paths that appeal to you.
- Learn what courses and admissions exams are required for the health professions you are considering.

Second Year

 Explore research opportunities available at Truman (or external opportunities). See <u>osr.truman.edu</u> to get started.

Third Year

Register for your admissions exam & start preparing to study.
 Most students [should] study for about 3-4 months (15-20 hours per week) in addition to their regular coursework.

Fourth Year

- Send thank you notes to evaluators/recommenders and mentors. If you have interviewed, consider sending a thank you note to your interviewers/admissions reps at the health professions school.
- Continue to hone your interviewing skills by using the Career Center and mock interviews.


