Spotlight on Health Professions:

Optometrist

What is an Optometrist?

Optometrists diagnose and treat issues with vision, diseases, injuries, and other problems associated with the eye. They perform vision exams and prescribe vision-correction solutions. Optometrists may do minor corrective surgeries, but ophthalmologists (medical doctors who specialize in eye surgery) do the majority of eye surgeries and treatment of eye diseases.

How do you become an Optometrist?

All optometrists must complete a Doctor of Optometry (O.D.) program after at least taking the pre-requisite courses at an undergraduate institution (some OD programs do not require a bachelors degree); most OD programs are four years. There are optional residencies after OD programs for optometrists who would like to do advanced training.

What is required to go to Optometry school?

These are the Truman equivalent of the general requirements to go to Optometry school:

- [CHEM 329 & 331, 330/332 or 333] or [CHEM 320] depends on major
- CHEM 335



Meet with a pre-health advisor or the pre-health coordinator:

If you are in your second year at Truman AND majoring in Biology, Chemistry, Exercise Science, or Health Science:

 You should meet with the designated pre-health advisor in your major. Depending on the department, some major advisors have a specific pre-health profession and some are versed in multiple prehealth professions.

If you are a first-year student OR a first-semester transfer OR are majoring in anything *other* than Biology, Chemistry, Exercise Science, or Health Science:
