TIMELINE

At this point in the year, most pre-health students should be...

First Year

- Educating yourself on how to be a competitive applicant, especially if you are trying to overcome a rough fall semester.
- Attending supplemental lectures or tutoring for your science and pre-requisite courses. Work on finding effective study methods that will help you retain the information you are learning now because it will be important later.

Second Year

- Looking into early admission program deadlines (some of them are due at the end of your sophomore year) and assessing your competitiveness for these programs.
- Investigating admissions exams. Most are taken during your third year. Start finding out what you need to know to do well.

Third Year

- Talking to faculty members, advisors, and health care professionals who know you well to ask IN PERSON if they would be willing to write a recommendation letter for your application. If they say yes, email them the following documents:
 - Resume/list of activities and accomplishments
 - Personal statement and/or a cover letter explaining your path, goals, etc.
 - Any other useful information for them (i.e., some direction on how to write a recommendation letter. For instance, the AAMC has a document specifically for letter writers for medical applications)

Fourth Year

- Interviewing, hopefully! Remember to send thank you letters or emails to your interviewers.
- Considering alternate options, especially if you haven't been scheduled for any interviews.


