

Sample Plan: Leadership MA

The plan listed below is designed to provide suggestions for sequencing your graduate program courses, but there are also other ways to sequence some programs. This plan is meant to provide aid in early, provisional planning. Please consult with your academic advisor to make strategic academic decisions about which courses to take each semester.

*The Leadership (MA) program offers **spring and fall entry terms**. Truman’s Master of Leadership requires a total of **30 credit hours** of coursework and is an online program with a mix of asynchronous and synchronous courses. The required coursework can be completed in as little as one year, but must be completed within six years of starting the program. This plan was made under the assumption that a student is beginning coursework in the **Fall semester and plans to pursue courses full-time**.*
